A refresher in the language of math

Addition	Addend + Addend = Sum
Subtraction	Minuend - Subtrahend = Difference
Multiplication	Factor x Factor = Product
Division	Dividend ÷ Divisor = Quotient (and sometimes a remainder!)
Fractions	$\frac{\text{Numerator}}{\text{Denominator}}$
